

There are exciting plans for Merthyr Tydfil Leisure Centre, Aberfan & Merthyr Vale Community Centre and the Splash Park and Cafe at Cyfarthfa Park, thanks to a new partnership between the Council and Halo Leisure.



Scott Rolfe, Halo's Chief Executive, said: "We are delighted to be selected by the Council as the operational partner for these leisure facilities. Our social enterprise business model and registered charity status allows us to trade for social purposes and 'not for profit', something the Council recognised as a sign of quality and strength."

Alyn Owen, our Deputy Chief Executive said: "We have seen the way Halo has transformed other leisure centres and pools and the dramatic impact that's had on visitor numbers and therefore the health of the communities around them."

Trelewis Wetlands: A Biodiversity Haven

Our hardworking Biodiversity team, along with great volunteers, have been busy monitoring the wetland at Trelewis and installing additional features throughout the area to signify the importance of this habitat and the species it supports.

A Dragonfly and Frog Totem Pole were installed to attract younger visitors, along with supporting education of species present at the site.









Furthermore, an additional Bug Hotel was installed, and half completed in hopes that local people visiting could add to it.

Alongside these new features a Magnifying post was installed which would allow children and adults to observe different flora and fauna on a bigger scale.

Much needed work on the woodland has been managed and natural paths being created by visitors of the site.

Lastly, a small scrape was constructed by the team coupled up with a Hügelkultur on its southern side, which will act as a place for invertebrates, mammals and amphibians to use. This will act as another form of habitat creation within the Wetland which will increase the biodiversity in the area.

This project was funded by Local Places for Nature and was a SUD's project to help try and mitigate the run-off water which was waterlogging the football pitch below.



Abercanaid Primary School's Eco Committee enjoyed a tour of our recycling depot and learned about what happens to our waste after it's collected from the kerbside.

The children watched a forklift demonstrate how food waste is emptied into giant bins, explored the storing areas for plastics, metals, cardboard and even saw the materials travelling along a conveyor belt, getting ready to be pressed into bales.

To end their tour, everyone received a goody bag made from recycled materials full of gifts - all recycled, of course!

Our **Bulky Rubble Service** is now available for large quantities of rubble generated from households that are carrying out minor improvements.

Rubble will be collected kerbside in tonne sacks provided by the council.

If we fail to achieve the 70% target, the Council will be fined £52K for every 1% under the target.



This will impact other services.

You can prevent this by using the recycling services provided.

- Prevent waste by choosing to reuse, donate or repair before recycling.
- Never place recyclables in your refuse bin, you could receive a fine and those resources are lost forever.
