The School Admissions Team oversees the Managed Moves within the LA and have established excellent working practices with schools, parent/carers, pupils to identify robust packages of support, where required, for a successful move of schools.

Close working relationships with ALN service, CLA, Education Inclusion and Social Services Intake and Assessment Team to ensure the needs of the individual pupil are considered and supported.

Continued attendance at panels such as Permanent Exclusions Panel and Tuition Panel.

Have you identified an increase in numbers for in-year admissions, if so, what action has been identified to address the issue?

The LA continues to reaffirm with its schools the need to admit pupils within a reasonable and appropriate timescale. Any resistance or obstruction will be referred to the forum for consideration.

The LA completed 170 in year primary applications during the academic year 2023/24, which was a reduction of 106 on the previous year.

In relation to secondary applications, the LA processed 56 in year applications, 46 applications less than the previous academic year.
