No Discussion/Action 10. **Special Tuition & PRU Clawbacks** The proposal to clawback the PDG element for eligible pupils who attend either Special Tuition or PRU, in addition to the AWPU. 2 options were presented to the working group for consideration: Option 1 – clawback daily AWPU & PDG rates. Option 2 – clawback daily AWPU (less 5% for eligible PDG pupils) plus daily PDG rates. 5% reduction allows schools to retain an element of funding to support pupils for reintegration. PDG element would be clawed back retrospectively in line with the funding allocation, so that no school would have to be charged prior to receiving funding. Option 2 was proposed by the Working Group, to be presented to the School Budget Forum for recommendation and implementation from April 2025. KM: As schools we need to provide a published plan for PDG spend will the LA / PRU also be required to publish a plan. SW: The PRU will publish a plan. KM: If a pupil is on special tuition for 1 or 2 hours a day or on a part time placement, will this be taken into account when reallocation ISB and PDG? Yes, the funding will equate to the provision received. JL: KM: The principle is fair, and the money would be used to support the provision of the pupils. Does anybody require further information or would like to proceed to vote? All parties agreed to vote on recommendation from Working Group to accept Option 2.
