

Work is underway to relocate Merthyr Tydfil's Indoor Market to the ground floor of the former Wilko premises in St Tydfil's Shopping Centre.

An exciting concept plan has been drawn up for a multifaceted, modern marketplace, with traditional elements. The space will also feature a sensory area, separate performance area and even a food hall.

Cllr Jamie Scriven, said: "We've shared these plans with our current tenants and are working closely with specialist architects to bring this vision to life. Our aim is to have the new indoor market ready and operational by Christmas this year."

We currently have 83 children and young people in foster care in Merthyr Tydfil; and we need more foster carers to ensure that all our children have the care and support they deserve.

In January the national network of 22 Welsh local authority fostering teams, Foster Wales, launched a campaign to recruit an additional 800 foster families by 2026.

Dowlais Engine House begins process of applying for Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW) registration as an open access play provider.

Play registration ensures that the environment is safe, that the setting operates to a high standard, and that the staff are competent and qualified, to care for and support children and young people.

The Council in partnership with Cymryd Rhan, supported the setting with their application. Through staff training in Playwork, reviewing of policies and procedures, and alterations to the building, the organisation fulfilled all registration requirements and in May 2025, they became the first CIW Registered Open Access Play Provider in Merthyr Tydfil.

Playground Refurbishment Programme Continues

The Council manages 51 fixed play areas throughout Merthyr Tydfil, many of which are coming to the end of their useful life and are in need of refurbishment.

It is recognised by the Council that outdoor play is vital for children's health, wellbeing and development.

In 2022, the Council committed a capital spend of £518K over 5 years.

To date, the funding programme has allowed the Council to complete the refurbishment of 14 play areas.

In 2025, the refurbishment of a further 4 play areas; Millennium Parc (Taf Bargoed), Haydn Terrace, Clare Street and Abercanaid have been completed.

Have your say with our Resident's Survey!



Residents of Merthyr Tydfil are being urged to report off-road vehicles in a bid to crack down on anti-social behaviour.

The Council is working in partnership with South Wales Police, Merthyr Tydfil Housing Association and Merthyr Valley Homes to raise awareness and ask for support from members of the community to share intelligence.

If you see an illegal off-road vehicle, you can report it to the police by calling 101, and where possible, provide a description of the vehicle and the person driving (for example, their clothing, colour of the helmet etc.)

You can also do this anonymously through Crimestoppers by calling 0800 555 111 or via the Crimestoppers website.
