1. Merthyr Tydfil Children with Disabilities Team is dedicated to supporting children with disabilities, their parents/carers and families living in the Merthyr Tydfil.

What do we do?

We are a team dedicated to supporting children with disabilities, their parents/carers and families living in the Merthyr Tydfil area.

Children with disabilities are defined as children aged 0 - 17 years who have a learning disability and or a significant physical or sensory impairment.

Whilst the team will continue to work with some children beyond their 18th birthday, most children will be transferred to the adult teams. The transition process' will be carefully managed to ensure that we still meet your needs.

How can I access the services on offer?

A referral to the Children with Disability Team can be made by the family or young person or by another agency acting for them.

What happens next?

The Children with Disabilities team provides assessments and services to disabled children and their families.

The team will work closely with the child or young person and their family and will listen to their views and help and support them in any way that they can. This includes working with other agencies such as:

- Occupational therapists, and respite care providers; Relevant health professionals, such as community paediatric nurses, portage worker and health visitors;
- Integrated Children's Services, Educational Child Psychologists, mainstream schooling or specialist schools; and voluntary organizations and various support services
- Leisure Link which provides a one to one service which enables children with diabilities to to access a variety of community based activites whilst providing respite for parent/carers.

What is an assessment?

To find out what support is needed and who will best give that help, we will need to find out more about you. This is ... known as an ASSESSMENT. This will enable us to find out if we can assist you and if so, what we can offer. The e is a SERVICE CRITERIA to be met before the Children with Disabilities team can offer you services. This will be explaned to you when you contact us. The type of support you regire will determine how quickly we are able to carry out an assessment.

What is a Disabled Facilities grant?

The Disabilities Facilities Grant can help meet the cost of adapting a property for the needs of a disabled person. The grant is managed by the Local Authority.

To be eligible for a disability facilities grant, you must be:

- an owner occupier;
- a private tenant;
- a landlord with a disabled tenant;
- a local authority tenant;
- a housing association tenant; or
- some occupiers of caravans and houseboats are also eligible.

You are treated as disabled if:

- Your sight, hearing or speech is substantially impaired;
- You have a mental disorder or impairment of any kind;
- You are physically substantially disabled by illness, injury, impairment present since birth, or otherwise;
- You are registered (or could be registered) disabled with the Social Services Department.

The Children's Community Team is a group of nurses especially qualified to care for and support children with Health Needs in the Community. They comprise of 3 nurses and 0.5 neonatal nurse. Part of their remit is the care of children with complex health needs, including children with various disabilities. They will act as the key worker to facilitate continuing care and meet any other health needs in collaboration with other professionals.

The Nurse Specialists are nurses who specialise in an area of expertise. We have specialist nurses for Epilepsy, Diabetes and Respiratory disease. These professionals work with the children and their families to enable them to live with their chronic disease/disability to an optimal level. They work in an integrated manner with all other agencies and professionals to achieve this.

Speech and Language Therapy Service can also be contacted at Kenshole Children's Hospital, The Speech and Language Therapy (SLT) service provides assessment, diagnosis and intervention for children with delayed or disordered speech, language and communication development. The statutory service is based in Hollies Health Centre, and works with children from both the Merthyr Tydfil and Cynon valleys who have identified special needs and statements. These children are seen in health centres or in mainstream schools (where appropriate).

The complex special needs SLT service is based in Kenshole Children's Centre (at Aberdare Hospital) and looks after children from both valleys with additional medical/health needs. These children have impaired speech, language or communication, in the context of an additional diagnosis, such as learning disabilities, autism, prematurity, physical disability, behavioural difficulties or acquired brain injury. This service also covers babies on SCBU and paediatric inpatients in Prince Charles Hospital, as well as children in special education (resource bases and special schools). Babies and children with oral impairments, such as muscle weakness, cleft lip/palate and swallowing/feeding difficulties are also managed by this service.
