9.	School Balances 2021-2023
	Members noted the above report which showed that as at 31 <sup>st</sup> March 2021, school balances were
	£6.3 million (actual) and £3.6 million (adjusted) which is 8.6% of formula funding. Adjusted figures
	take into account almost £2.7 million grant income from Welsh Government which was received
	too late in the financial year to spend by year end.

## No Discussion/Action 10. **LRB Funding** AL explained that LRB funding has been discussed previously at the Forum. The funding queries had been investigated and found that there had been an error in the average teacher salary calculation and positive adjustments would need to be made to schools with LRB classes. The funding of LRB units will now be considered by the Working Group. 11. Efficiency Savings 2023/2024-2024/2025 Steve Jones explained that the rise in inflation had placed a lot of pressure on the current budget. It was likely that these pressures would continue to increase over the coming months. This will include general inflation, falling income and higher pay awards than had been estimated. For the current financial year, we now have a projected overspend of £3 million as at 31st March 2023. We may be able to off-set some of this against our contingency fund, but you can only do that once. Based on our current indicative budget for 2023/2024 we will have a deficit of £5.5 million, if the new settlement does not take into account inflation increase, we would have a deficit of £11 million. Whatever the settlement, we anticipate significant cuts to our funding, and this has been discussed by Cabinet and at this stage we would like the Forum to consider three possible levels of efficiency savings: -£500k, -£1 million, -£1.5 million. Members discussed and explained that the School Forum had been asked to do this in previous discussions and had come to the conclusion that there were no further areas that could be 'trimmed' and the only option was to top-slice. It was agreed that the Chief Finance Officer provide feedback following the budget settlement announcement and that further action be considered at that time. **12.
