2.	Budget Reductions 2023-2024	
	AB: May I apologise for the delay in getting back to you, but the Cabinet has been un thorough review of our finances for next year and as a result of factors such a funding and a lower forecast rate of inflation, we have been able to revise our schools for savings and will now ask for £1.5 million savings and not the £2.5 million at the previous meeting.	s additional r request to
	SJ: The reduction is possible as we have found extra savings from other depart contingency balance and a Council Tax increase.	tments, our

	Discussion/Action
RM:	We are grateful for the reduction and appreciate the efforts made to reduce the cut. No cut is welcome, but can I thank Councillor Barry.
PP:	Is this just a proposition at this stage as the full Council will need to set the budget and this has not yet happened?
AB:	It will need to be confirmed by Council, but we have had discussions with Labour colleagues, and they have indicated their support and we are hopeful that it will be agreed.
PP: AL:	What is the revised percentage decrease? It will reduce from 5.15% to 3.04%.
	We have two items for consideration today - a ISB reduction of 3.04% for 2023/2024 and to remove the Discretionary Clothing Allowance, this will only impact secondary schools and save £67,000. We are seeking agreement to these proposals in today's meeting and then we will have a two-week consultation exercise with Chairs of Governors. The findings of the consultation will then be included in the report to Council when considering the budget.
PP:	Are we seeking agreement to the % reduction or to the methodology regarding how this would be found?
AL:	Agreement was provided in the last meeting for the methodology to apply the reduction and we are now seeking approval for the two proposals to reduce funding.
PP:	Thank you, but it seems strange to be seeking our agreement to something that Council could turn down.
AL:	The processes and methodology are agreed as it's a statutory requirement to consult with the Schools Budget Forum on proposals prior to decisions being taken.
KM t	hen joined the meeting and took the Chair.
KM:	Thank you Ryan for standing in and apologies for being late.
AL:	If I can ask IK to share the spreadsheet on how the £1.5 million will be achieved.
A sp	readsheet was shared, and IK explained the impact of the 3.04% cut to school budgets.
RM: AL:	We mentioned it at the previous meeting but the cut for Greenfield seems high? I wasn't at the last meeting but based on the draft minutes from that meeting the Head indicated that further support from the LA may be required.
KM:	If we are ready to proceed with a vote on these issues, can I first put forward the proposal to remove the Discretionary Clothing Allowance funding which will save £67,000.
	bers unanimously agreed to accept the proposal to remove the funding for the Discretionary ning Allowance.
км:	Can we take a vote on the proposal to reduce the ISB by 3.04% for 2023/2024?

No	Discussion/Action
	Members voted, 10 in favour and 2 against and therefore it was agreed to accept the reduction of 3.04% to school budgets.
	KM: Thank you, as we have now agreed these proposals, are you able to explain how we are now to proceed as this is likely to have a significant impact.
	SW: Your Governor Support Officers are working on the budgets and will discuss with Headteachers. If there is a need for staff redundancy, the procedures will be explained, and HR Officers will also be available to advise on procedures for ending temporary contracts or the redundancy process if necessary.
	PP: It is difficult to see how we can start considering this before the Council has set the budget. We can start considering options, but I would advise not making final decisions in case there is a change in circumstances.
	SW: You need to start considering your options as soon as possible, redundancy is a long process as your Support Officer, HR, Governing Body and Trade Unions need to be involved.
	PP: Should schools be feeding back as to the implications of any cuts?
	SW: As explained by Anthony there is a consultation with all schools and there is an opportunity within this for each school to explain the impact on their budgets and school delivery.
	LM: What is the situation with voluntary redundancy?
	SW: You will need to consider your temporary contracts first but there will be a VER Scheme.
	AL: VER will be in line with the current policy which is at the statutory level which the Council pays and an additional 20% paid by the school.
	KM: If there are no more points, may I thank the Councillors and Officers for their work and again thank Councillor Barry for helping reduce the level of the cut. Schools will face a difficult time and it will have a significant impact on availability to deliver targets.
